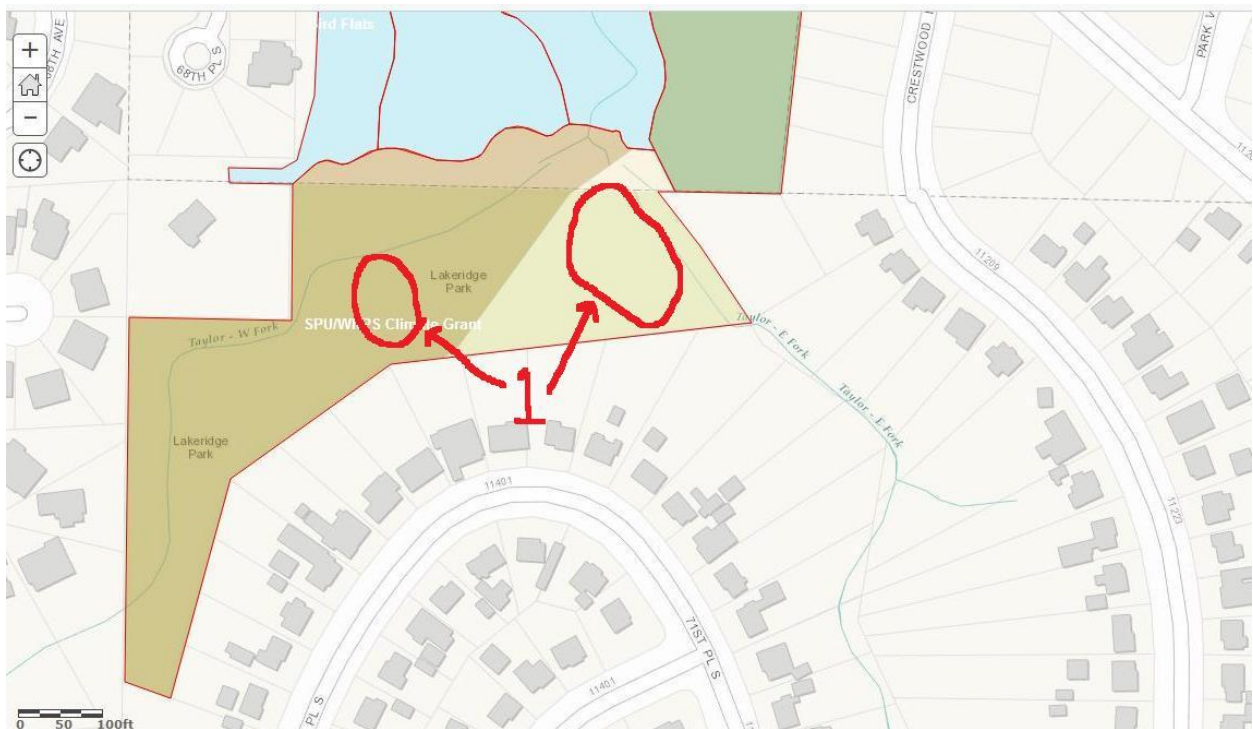

Site #1

I planted 50 cedars at site #1 on Thursday Feb 25. Getting to this site, in the far south portion of Deadhorse Canyon, requires hiking a mile from the trailhead, then fording the east fork of Taylor Creek. The eastern of the two planting zones, next to the east fork, is quite wet and level. The western zone is reached by following the trail (not shown on map) uphill along the south border of the park, then dropping down off trail into the wet, but not too steep, slide area.



Site #2

Bill and I planted 21 Douglas fir, 45 cedars, 15 grand fir, and 17 hemlock in Site #2. That's a total of 98 trees. The site is due east of the trailhead. There's a ravine running east-west through the south part of the site. The ravine divides the Rustic Rd site from "Taylor Creek East (TCE)." Some plantings were in the TCE site, but most were on the north side of the ravine, in Rustic Rd. We planted cedars in the wettest spots.



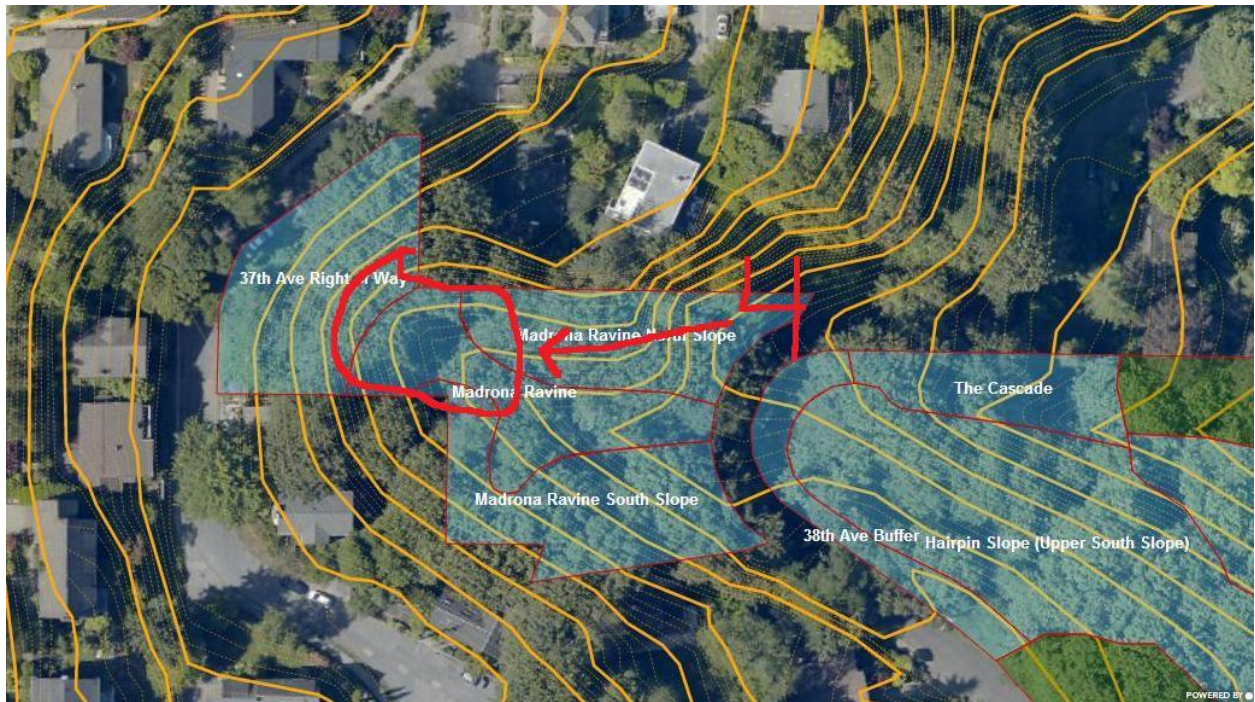
Site #3

"The Meadow" in Madrona Woods is a flat sunny area just to the east of 38th Ave. We cleared the blackberry years ago, but the resulting thimbleberry thicket has made it hard to establish conifers. On Saturday, Feb 27, Deirdre, Judith and I aggressively pruned the thimbleberry, and densely planted, 29 Douglas fir, 15 grand fir, for a total of 44 trees.



Site #4

Site 4 is in the far west (uphill) part of Madrona Woods, just below 37th Ave. It contains the headwaters of Madrona Creek. On Monday Feb 29, Deirdre planted 28 trees (20 Douglas fir, 5 cedar, 3 hemlock) here.



Site #5

Site 5 is on a steep east-facing slope above Lake Washington Blvd, between the restrooms and the dance studio. This area was cleared, poorly, and never planted by GSP-hired contractors in 2008-9, and we have been stuck maintaining it ever since. I planted 30 Douglas firs here on Monday, Feb 29.
